You may be wondering how you can stay in touch with family and friends at home. You'll probably also want to call or email home as soon as you arrive, as your family will want to know that you have traveled safely to Yale. Here are some ways you can get connected immediately.

Internet

[On-Campus](#)

Yale University has [free high-speed wifi all over campus](#) [2] (YaleSecure) for anyone in the Yale Community with NetID. If you don't have a NetID, you can still use the more limited YaleGuest network.

If you are experiencing connection issues on campus, contact the ITS Help Desk (see below for more information).

[Off-Campus](#)

There are a number of coffee shops and restaurants/bars that offer free wifi, however you are usually expected to make a purchase if you are occupying space inside. Chain cafes and restaurants such as Blue State Coffee and Starbucks always have free wifi. [More options are available here](#) [3].

To obtain high-speed cable or broadband DSL Internet service in your off-campus residence or graduate apartment, you will need to consult one of the outside providers in the area, such as [GoNetSpeed](#) [4], [Frontier](#) [5] or [Comcast](#) [6]. Yale University does not offer high-speed Internet access in any off-campus housing.

If you are off-campus and need to use resources available only on-campus, you will need to use the [Yale VPN](#) [7].

Voice & Video

[Apps & Online Platforms](#)

There are a variety of apps and online platforms that make communication easier, such as Zoom, FaceTime, Skype, Viber, and WhatsApp. However, you and your loved ones should make sure that you can download and use these platforms without any restrictions.

[VoIP](#)

VoIP (Voice-over Internet Protocol) is a popular way for visitors to communicate internationally. Services such as Skype and Google Voice are the most well-known of these. Both services allow you to connect to another person

Yale NetID

[The Yale NetID](#) [8] is provided to most Yale students and scholars by their school or department. It allows access to the campus network and many University systems. [Information Technology Services](#) [9] (ITS) at Yale can answer questions relating to NetIDs or Yale network connectivity.

If you're off campus and you need to log in with your NetID and password, you will need to dual authenticate with [DUO Everywhere](#) [10].
