

## English Language Proficiency

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## English Proficiency Requirement and Evidence of English Proficiency

All J-1 Exchange Visitors are required by the Department of State to have sufficient proficiency in the English language to successfully to participate in their academic program and to function on a day-to-day basis in the United States.
